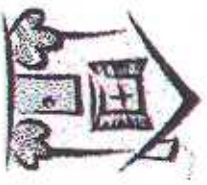

OVERVIEW

TURNING POINT:

- Is the **sole provider** of Domestic Violence support in six counties.
- Serves the **largest area** of any Domestic Violence program in Ohio.
- Provides **24-Hour Emergency Support Hotline**.
- Is the **only** Domestic Violence social service agency **responding to the scene**.
- Responded to almost **5,000** calls last year.
- Provides **individualized needs assessment** for every client.
- Provided **2,322** client days and **5,287** family days last year.
- The average length of stay has grown from 12 days to 19 days (1997-2002).
- Provides a highly trained staff of **experts** in Domestic Violence.
- Since 1979, Turning Point has had **3,079** sheltered **admissions** and served **2,246** families.



TURNING POINT

THE PROBLEM

- Domestic Violence is the **single largest cause of injury to women (US)** ...more common than injuries from car accidents, muggings and rapes combined.
- Domestic Violence occurs every **12 seconds** in the United States.
- Total "**costs**" of Domestic Violence are staggering.
 - Healthcare costs estimated at **\$5 to \$10 billion** annually.
 - **\$4.5 billion** in missed work.
- One out of **four** women are victims of Domestic Violence.
- **35%** of all hospital emergency room visits are related to Domestic Violence.
- The average victim **leaves five to seven times** before leaving for good.
- **80%** of violent juvenile offenders and adult criminals come from homes where abuse took place.
- Domestic Violence encompasses **ALL** socio-economic, ethnic, religious, racial, age and gender backgrounds.
- Up to **50%** of all homeless women and children in the United States are from Domestic Violence.

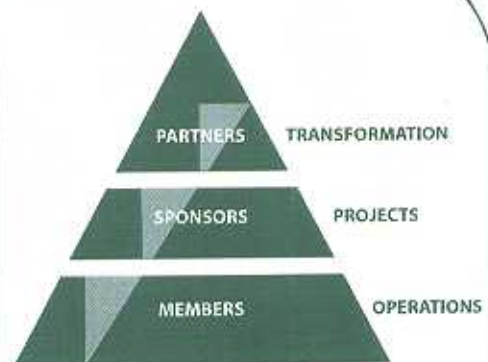

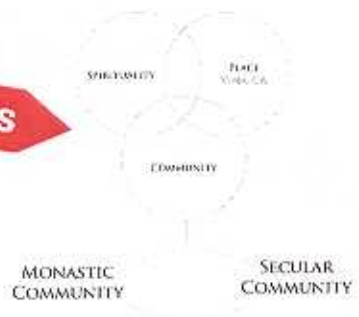

 - 1411 - ST BERNARD'S MONASTERY ABBEY IN CLAIRVAUX FRANCE
 - 1492 - SANTA MARIA DE OCA MONASTERY IN BURGOS - CASTILE SPAIN
 - 1848 - FOUNDING OF GETHSEMAN WORKSHOP - KENTUCKY
 - 1931 - WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST PURCHASES CIVILA CHAPTER HOUSE - BRICK STONES TO CALIFORNIA
 - 1965 - 25 MONKS FROM GETHSEMAN ABBEY IN VIRIA AND FOUND ABBEY OF NEW CLAIRVAUX
 - 1975 - FATHER THOMAS BUYS THE SACRED STONES IN GOLDEN GATE PARK - A VISION'S JOURN
 - 1994 - FINE ARTS MUSEUMS OF SAN FRANCISCO ACQUIRES SACRED STONES TO THE ABBEY OF NEW CLAIRVAUX
 - 2005 - RESTORATION OF 180 YEAR OLD CHAPTER HOUSE BEGINS

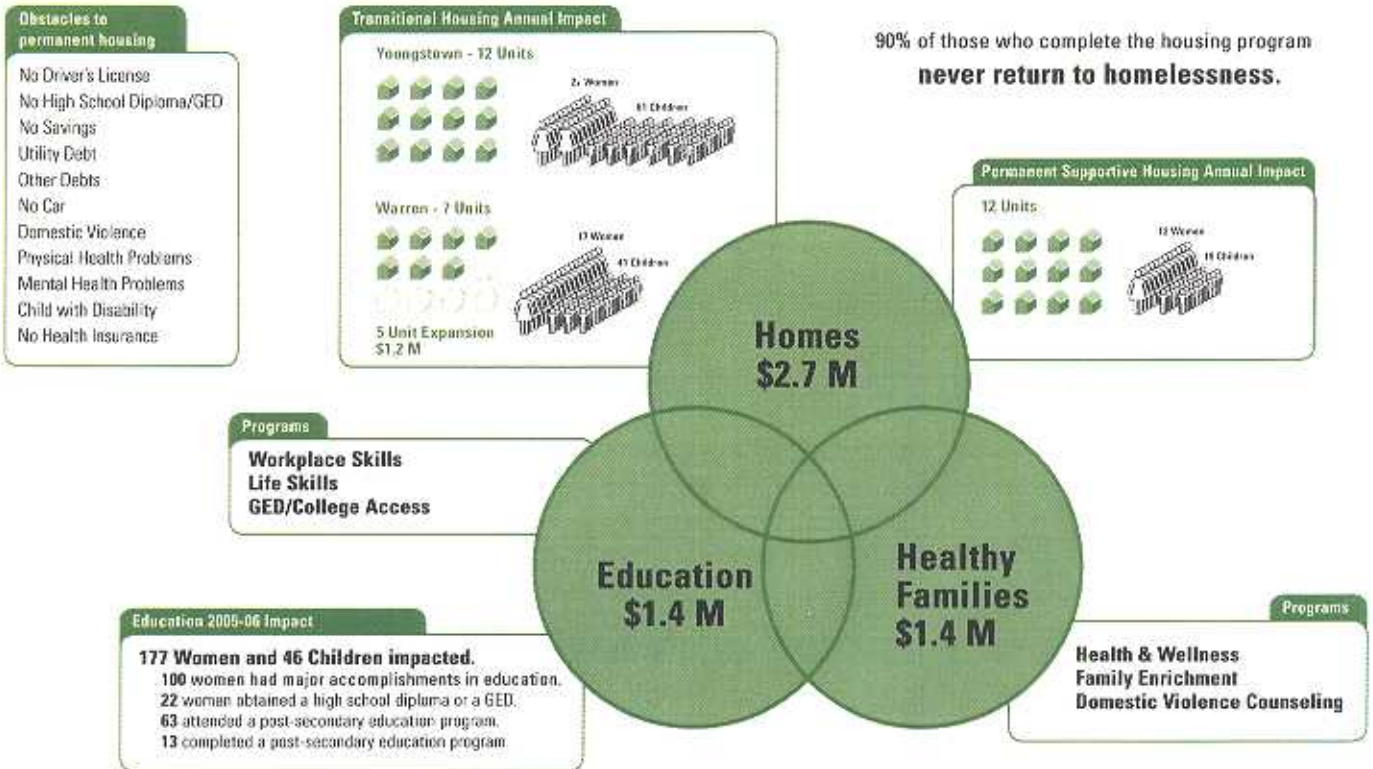

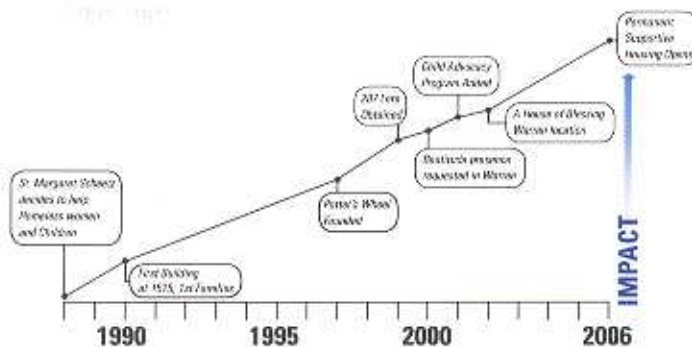

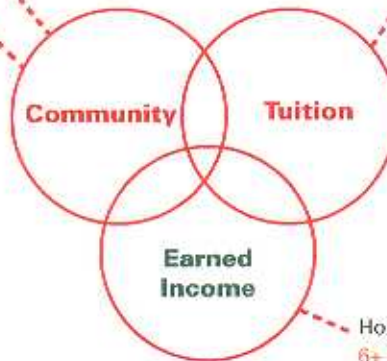
